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BIOGRAPHY:

An astute observer will notice something a bit strange at an organissimo performance. The audience won't be like your typical homogenous "jazz" audience. Instead, you'll see a healthy mix of people from all walks of life; young and old, black and white, from hippies to corporate professionals and everything in between. organissimo's music skirts over fences and satisfies a diverse range of tastes. You're as likely to see people dancing as a table of folks intently listening.

As New York Times contributor Elvis Mitchell wrote, "The group's toned, muscular playing keeps the crowd rapt, a condition noticeable by the fact that almost no one is talking."

organissimo formed in late 2000 as a performance vehicle for guitarist Joe Gloss and organist Jim Alfredson's growing stable of original tunes. When they first met at Michigan State University in the late 90s, the two quickly recognized a rare musical chemsitry and began a search for a complimentary drummer. Randy Marsh fit the puzzle perfectly.

From the beginning, organissimo has focused on original material and extending the tradition of the classic organbased trio. organissimo's sound is instantly identifiable yet constantly evolving, incorporating elements of funk, gospel, blues, progressive rock, and fusion into a solid foundation of jazz. Shifting meters, deep grooves, melodic finesse and tight ensemble interplay are hallmarks of the organissimo sound.

His father earned a living as a professional musician for many years and encouraged Jim's talents from a very young age. Some of Jim's earliest memories include pulling on the drawbars of his father's Hammond B3 at the age of four.

Jim began writing his own songs at the age of eight on a Yamaha organ. A plethora of synthesizers and multitrack machines followed until he came full circle at sixteen and began lusting after the sound of the Hammond organ once again. Jim has immersed himself in the study of this mighty instrument ever since, dedicated to the goal of uncovering new directions within the great tradition of the organ trio.

In addition to his role in organissimo, Jim is also organist and musical director in the award-winning band Root Doctor, one of Michigan's premier rhythm & blues groups.

Joe Gloss picked up a guitar at the age of 8 to learn bluegrass and never looked back. His musical journey has carried him through many genres before finally settling into jazz in the early 1990s.

cal background makes him adept in almost any style but he found his true musical voice studying jazz and classical guitar.

Joe's strengths, including his beautiful harmonic sense and exquisite writing, perfectly compliment the rest of the group, pushing organissimo in new and dramatic directions.

Randy Marsh is known throughout the state of Michigan as the drummer of choice. His resume is distinguised and long but he has never rested on his well-deserved laurels. With organissimo, Randy has found another outlet for his experience, his endless creativity, and his positive spirituality.

Randy comes from a musical family as well. His father, Arno Marsh, played saxophone in Woody Herman's Thundering Herd, Stan Kenton's big band, and in Buddy Rich's band. And he is still a staple of the Las Vegas jazz scene after over 50 years. But Randy credits his mother, jazz singer Mary Lou Marsh, for giving him a deep love of jazz.

Randy has been drumming for almost 40 years and shows no sign of slowing down. Indeed, he is at the peak of his playing with organissimo, bringing fire and intensity as well as his trademark sense of humor.



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
